# Geographical Delicacy

## The *terroir* of Charlevoix

Charlevoix is a region known for its landscapes of mountains, lakes, forests and agricultural fields which, since the nineteenth century, has inspired both painters and vacationers. Today, Charlevoix is distinguished by its innovative agro-tourism production, a unique cultural life and the opportunity to offer visitors a sense of belonging transmitted through the landscape and outdoor activities like hiking and art.

To make the most of this landscape, the tour begins by train in Québec City. Several stopovers are planned at Baie-St-Paul, Saint-Joseph-de-la-Rive and Isle-aux-Coudres, St-Irénée, and La Malbaie. Each stop which allow us to explore the surrounding villages and national parks. We will visit an interpretation center of a massive meteorite crater that has shaped the region, agrotourism companies (e.g. cheese and dairy producers recognized for their social and environmental implication), a family cider house, a tomato vineyard, and a historical holiday resort. Also on our list are regional cultural festivals and hiking in the national parks, all of which will be fueled by exceptional regional restaurants offering local menus.

This excursion will allow you to understand the hybridity between territory, culture and local products. On-site travel will be by train, bicycle and bus, depending on the distance to be traveled.
